ADVICE: For the working adult we recommend a maximum of 3 courses for the semester and no more than 2 in Summer

Year 1 Students: We recommend that you register for a <u>no more than 3</u> courses during the semesters and 2 courses in summer. As an adult learner with competing responsibilities for your time, it is very important during your first year working in this online environment that you adhere to this recommendation. Once you have successfully completed your first year in this programme you will be in a better position to determine if you are able to take on increased credit hours. Your Level 1 courses are very important to prepare you for your Levels 2 and 3 courses. It is important therefore that you make your first year a success.

TIP: First Year Students

- Examine your Offer Letter from Admissions to determine if you are required to take ELPT and IYMS. These are prerequisites for two Level 1 courses.
- Take the ELPT and IYMS in your first year.

• Plan wisely to ensure the successful completion of all courses you register for this academic year.

Courses being repeated should be taken at the first available opportunity before you attempt to register for courses at the next level.
