New Students

Continuing Students

Students are required to successfully complete all courses in Year 1 before they can proceed to undertake courses in Year 2. Please continue to follow the prescribed course of study given.

Advice For Managing Course Load

Your course load is 5 courses in Semester 1 and 5 in Semester 2.

IMPORTANT NOTE for New Students

Orientation is the first step to achieving academic and personal success at the UWI Open Campus. It supports you by assisting with your transition to the online environment. It will equip you with the needed navigational skills to function successfully online and provide pertinent information about the available services, go to persons and responsibilities as an online student. It is imperative that you attend the online sessions offered by the Online Programmes Delivery Department (OPDD) as well as any sessions offered by the Pre-University.

The **ASC Paralegal Studies (PALS)** is designed to provide a sound academic foundation and exposure to legal practice and procedure in Caribbean Jurisdictions to enable paralegals to function effectively in contemporary law offices. Students build skills in areas such as law office management and information technology. The **ASc in Paralegal Studies** programme is delivered online, with some face-to-face components. The **ASc. in Paralegal Studies** provides normal matriculation for the Bachelors of Law Degree (LLB) at the University of the West Indies.

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The **ASc in Paralegal Studies** operates under a semester system.

- Semester 1 and 2 each, have thirteen (13) weeks of instruction plus an assessment period.
- Summer session has seven (7) weeks of instruction plus the assessment period.

Requirements for an Award: To be eligible for the award of the **Associate Degree in Paralegal Studies** a student must successfully complete the equivalent of sixty (60) credits distributed as follows:

- Six (6) Compulsory General Education Courses (18 credits)
- Fourteen (14) compulsory Core Courses (42 credits)

Duration of the programme: Students must complete the programme in a maximum of nine (9) semesters (3 years), from date of registration. Each course is 39 contact hours.

Assessment Methods: The work of students will be assessed and evaluated on a continuous basis through assignments, class-work, tests and quizzes. Assessment requirements are noted in the course outline of each course with clear guidelines, due dates and the weighting for each assessment task.

Prerequisites for Matriculation into the Associate Degree programme:

- **Mathematics Requirements:** minimum Mathematics requirement is a pass at CSEC or the equivalent. Candidates who do not meet this requirement must successfully complete an approved remedial Mathematics course.
- **English Language Requirements:** The English Language Proficiency Test (ELPT) is used to assess whether applicants to the ASc possess a satisfactory level of writing and reading proficiency in English for university academic purposes. ELPT, ACRS0003, or equivalent is a prerequisite for FOUN1001: English for Academic Purposes.
- **Technology Requirement:** Students will need to have access to a computer with Internet access.

Leave of Absence (LOA): If you are unable to take a course, you need to inform your Pre-U tutor or Pre -U Coordinator
