Responsibilities of Course Instructors include but are not limited to:

- providing overall academic and pedagogic supervision for the delivery of the course.
- monitoring the teaching/learning process to ensure that students are given appropriate guidelines and provide support to assist students in their study of the course.
- facilitating interaction and discussion with the students assigned to the course
- grading and providing feedback on activities and assignments
- fostering a healthy, learner-centred, online teaching/learning environment
- responding to individual students and/or group concerns and queries
- working collaboratively with OPDD and adjunct staff for effective delivery of the course

Minimum Qualifications

- A <u>**PhD or Doctoral Degree**</u> related to the field.
- Teaching certification and/or teaching experience is required, preferably at the tertiary level. Prior experience in online facilitation would be an asset.

Requirements

- Reliable access to a computer with fast speed Internet connectivity.
- Good working knowledge of the Internet and use of Microsoft Office products.
- Good written communication skills for interacting in the online environment.
- Sensitivity to the needs of students from diverse settings and backgrounds.
- Applicants must have experience in teaching/training adult learners at the tertiary education level, in the public sector or in the industry. Persons who have formal qualifications in the academic discipline enjoy a distinct advantage.

Training

Successful candidates will be required to complete UWI Open Campus training in online instruction, as well as a research supervision course. Some courses will be completed prior to the start of teaching.

Remuneration

Facilitators will be paid a fixed fee on satisfactory completion of all assigned tasks; this fee covers a contribution towards the cost of Internet usage for the course. All fees will be subject to tax.
