**New Students** 

Students who enrolled as of Academic Year 2025/2026 must follow the prescribed course of study and sequence given for their programme.

Continuing Students

Students are required to successfully, complete all courses in Year 1 before they can proceed to undertake courses in Year 2. Please continue to follow the prescribed course of study given. Courses being repeated should be taken at the first available opportunity before you attempt to register for courses at the next Level.

Advice For Managing Course Load Most students carry between 1-3 courses per semester. For the working adult, we recommend that you do not attempt more than three (3) courses per semester and two (2) courses in summer. Plan wisely to suit your particular situation so you may perform at your full potential. Do not jeopardize your long-term goals by being unrealistic about what you can handle.

#### **IMPORTANT NOTE for New Students**

Orientation is the first step to achieving academic and personal success at the UWI Global Campus. It supports you by assisting with your transition to the online environment. It will equip you with the needed navigational skills to function successfully online and provide pertinent information about the available services, go-to persons and responsibilities as an online student. This new undergraduate **Diploma in Social Work** from The UWI Global Campus builds on a 50-year legacy of the University offering top-level and innovative training to social work practitioners across the Caribbean region. This brand-new online option is designed to allow participants to foster and demonstrate understanding of core theories and practices in social work through new ways of thinking and learning.

The programme reflects fundamental themes necessary for region-building and development, including advocacy for human rights and social justice for the advancement of communities, groups or individuals in order to release human potential for self-empowerment.

Students who complete the **Diploma in Social Work** with The Global Campus may be given credits for previous studies undertaken in order to pursue the Diploma or BSc in Social Work.

Note that the entry requirements for the Certificate, Diploma and BSc. Social Work are the same.

The **Diploma in Social Work** operates under a semester system.

- Semesters 1 and 2 have thirteen (13) weeks of instruction each
- The summer session has seven (7) weeks of instruction.

All courses in the programme will be offered online or blended. In the context of The UWI Global Campus, a fully online programme includes the following:

- Most materials provided by The Global Campus for the study of the course are made available online through The Global Campus' learning management system, The Learning Exchange;
- Most teaching-learning activities (with the exception of fieldwork in the practicum) are conducted in the Learning Exchange;
- Most assessment-related activities are conducted in the Learning Exchange;
- In instances where students are required to engage in course-related activity off-line in the real-world environment, all output from such activity, in whatever format, must be submitted through the Learning Exchange.

## Pre-requisites for Matriculation into the BSc Social Work Programme

The programme is intended to cater to a wide range of people who work with young children and their families in a variety of settings across the region. In this regard, the programme is targeted at both experienced professionals and beginners in childhood and family studies. New entrants must meet The University's normal matriculation requirements in order to be accepted into the programme. They must satisfy the requirements in either (a) or (b) or (c) or (d) below:

- (a) As entrants with CXC-CSEC and GCE qualifications having:
- An acceptable pass (see below) in CXC-CSEC Mathematics or its equivalent; AND
- An acceptable pass (see below) in CXC-CSEC English A; AND
- One of the following minimum qualifications:
- Either five subjects (at least two GCE A Level or CAPE) and the remainder acceptable passes (see below) in CXC-CSEC or GCE O' Level; OR
- Four subjects (at least three GCE A Level or CAPE) and the fourth an acceptable pass (see below) in the CXC-CSEC or GCE O' Level

#### Grade requirements for CXC/CSEC subjects are General Proficiency, Grades I or II pre-1998 and Grades I, II, or III from June 1998.

- (b) Holders of five (5) CXC-CSEC or GCE O-Level passes or equivalent, not necessarily obtained at the same sitting.
- (c) Entrants with a Certificate from The UWI or another approved Caribbean tertiary level institution, having attained a B+ average or a minimum GPA of 2.5.
- (d) Persons over the age of 21, who have been out of school for at least five years, based on their overall academic and professional attainments.
- Mathematics Requirements: For entry to the Undergraduate programmes, an approved qualification in Mathematics is required. The minimum Mathematics requirement is a pass at CSEC or the equivalent. Candidates who do not meet this requirement must successfully complete the approved remedial Mathematics course (MATH0900). MATH0900 is offered in semester 1, 2 and summer.
- English Language Requirements: All undergraduate students must demonstrate proficiency in English Language before they can register for FOUN1001 - English for Academic Purposes. This can be done in the following ways:
- 1) Students must **EITHER** possess a passing grade in one of the following exams and courses (see Exemptions) **OR**
- 2) Successfully complete ONE of the two prerequisites:
  - a) **Current students** must pass the FOUN0003 Communication and Use of English course (formally ACRS003), which is a prerequisite for FOUN1001.

b) **Applicants/ incoming students** must successfully pass the English Language Proficiency Test (ELPT) on the first attempt or must successfully complete the FOUN0003 course.

 Technology Requirement: Students will need to have access to a computer with Internet access.
