Applications are invited from suitably qualified persons for the post of **Lecturer/Senior Lecturer** in **Early Childhood Care and Education** at the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus, Barbados.

The successful candidate should possess a PhD in Early Childhood Care and Education or a closely related field. An active research profile and a record of scholarly publications would be a distinct advantage and is required for appointment at the Senior Level. Emphasis will be placed on candidates' experience as a teacher at early childhood level and sound knowledge of education systems in the Caribbean.

The successful candidate will be required to:

- a) report to the Director of the School of Education, teach and advise in our undergraduate and graduate programmes.
- b) supervise undergraduate and graduate research projects/theses
- c) conduct online instruction in addition to traditional delivery of instruction
- d) coordinate the early childhood care and education component of the Associate Degree in Education administered by the Eastern Caribbean Joint Board of Teacher Education (ECJBTE)
- e) interact with the national institutions in the region that are members of the ECJBTE
- f) conduct and publish research and contribute to the pursuit of grant funding, in addition to serving as a member of MPhil and PhD research and thesis advisory committees,
- g) develop and implement a research agenda that includes empirical studies related to the practical, developmental and educational needs of Barbados and the wider Caribbean.
- h) engage in productive scholarship in the discipline, and participate in service activities within and outside the University.

Required Qualifications:

- An earned doctorate in Early Childhood Care and Education, or closely related area.
- Ability and willingness to teach undergraduate and graduate courses.
- Commitment to excellence in teaching and mentoring student research.
- Willingness to teach courses in a blended format; online and face-to-face.
- Commitment to using technology in teaching and scholarship.
- Evidence of an emerging research agenda.
- Potential for securing external funding for research and/or training.
- Ability to contribute to a positive work environment in the School, Faculty, and University

Preference will be given to applicants who have:

- Teacher training
- Expertise in the areas of learning theory, motivation, assessment, and/or human development.
- At least two years of teaching or working in an official capacity with early childhood education institutions and/or primary schools.
- Teaching experience in higher education
- Expertise in current issues and best practices in early childhood care and education.
- Knowledge of and experience in using technology for learning and/or online education
- Coursework in or experience with both quantitative and qualitative research
- Potential to attract external funding

The successful applicant will be expected to assume duties by **January 1, 2022** or as soon as possible thereafter.

Present Vacancy

The School of Education in the Faculty of Humanities and Education offers B.Ed., B.A. Psychology and M. Ed. degree programmes. The B.Ed. has specialisations in Early Childhood Care and Education, Education Administration, Language Arts/Literacy Education, Special Needs Education, Science Education and Mathematics Education, Social Studies Education and Testing and Measurement. The M.Ed. has specialisations in Curriculum Studies, Educational Leadership, Inclusive Practices for Special Needs Students, Language and Literacy Education, Social Context and Education Policy, School Counselling, Science and Technology Education, Testing Measurement and Evaluation, and The Psychology of Education. There are also research-oriented degrees (M. Phil. And Ph. D.) in education. SUMMARY OF TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE - ACADEMIC STAFF

Post - Lecturer / Senior Lecturer in Early Childhood Care and Education

Note: This is a tenure track position and the appointee may continue in the service of the University, by mutual consent, until the retiring age of 65 years.

Initial appointment will be on contract for a period of three years in the first instance.

(a) Salary Scales – the salary scales accord with the level at which the appointments are made. Salary scale and point of entry will depend on the qualifications and experience of the successful candidate.

Lecturer (Non-Medical)

BDS\$94,968 + 3,852 - 118,080 (BAR) + 3,852 - 141,192 per annum

Senior Lecturer Scale (Non-Medical)

BDS\$145,044 + 3,852 - 148,896 + 4,284 - 183,168 (BAR) x 4,572 - 192,312 per annum

Note: these are graduated scales that progress from the minimum point to the top of the scale by annual increments except where a merit bar requires formal assessment before crossing. For example, the scale for Lecturer (Non-Medical) runs as follows:

Minimum point \$94,968 2nd point \$98,820 (94,968 + 3852) 3rd point \$102,672 (98,820 + 3852) Etc.

(b) Allowances

- Regional Allowance 5% of basic salary
- *Housing Allowance* 20% of basic salary

(c) Benefits

- Transportation Allowance BDS\$2760 per annum
- Book Grant \$3000 per annum
- Study and Travel Grant BDS\$9,673 per annum (special conditions apply)
- Registration in Medical Scheme (currently non-contributory)

(d) **Pension Arrangements**

Each full time employee is required to contribute to the University Pension Scheme (FSSU). The contribution rates are Employee 5%, UWI 10%. The sums are invested to provide a pension at age 65, the age of retirement.

(e) Other

For persons recruited from overseas:

- Airfares economy class passages (self, spouse and up to three dependent children under 22 years of age) on appointment and normal termination
- Shipping of household and personal effects up to US\$3,000 on appointment and normal termination.
- Shipment of academic books/teaching research equipment up to US\$600 on appointment and normal termination.
